Kwanzaa is a holiday that honors African American people and their culture. It is celebrated from December 26 to January 1. Dr. Maulana Karenga, an African American teacher, created the holiday in 1966 to help African Americans learn about their African history, culture, and customs. He studied many different harvest festivals that are celebrated throughout Africa before he created the new holiday. He named the holiday Kwanzaa which means 'first fruits' in Swahili. Feasts called karamu are held on the night before the last day of Kwanzaa. People perform in plays and gives speeches.
